### Search the library for books on Garden History:

Try a <b>keyword search</b>	garden history, historic gardens, 19 <sup>th</sup> century gardens, or specific garden names
Try a <b>subject search</b>	Historic Gardens, Italian Gardens, Gardens-History
<b>Browse</b> the stacks or <a href="#">library catalog</a>	Ask library staff for subject-specific call numbers
